Notice of Proposed Rule Filing

This is posted pursuant to the requirements of Executive Order 2011-01K and SB2 of the 129th General Assembly, which require state agencies, including the State Board of Psychology, to draft rules in collaboration with stakeholders, assess and justify any adverse impact on the business community (as defined by SB2), and provide an opportunity for the affected public to provide input on the rules.

The Psychology Board is proposing to amend rules to eliminate the requirement that initial license applications and training verification forms be notarized—in preparation for the online application process in the Ohio eLicensing 3.0 license management portal. This is a modest “clean up” set of proposed changes that also clarifies that there is no monetary penalty for those seeking to reinstate a license placed in “retired” status.

The rules proposed for amendment and subject to potential adverse impact on business are:

4732-1-02 Application for licensure

4732-1-06 Biennial registration
